Mental and Behavioral Healthcare Needs in Silver Bay

Wilderness Health Hosts Community Listening Sessions


Silver Bay, Minn. - Mental and behavioral health needs remain a challenge throughout the state of Minnesota, and the unique needs of rural Minnesotans require targeted attention. To learn more about the needs of residents of Lake County, Wilderness Health invited community members to share their stories and help shape the future of mental health care. The listening session was held on Monday, May 20th at the North Shore Area Partners building in Silver Bay, MN.

Attendees shared stories of the ongoing challenges of stigma faced by those who suffer mental and behavioral health challenges alone. Communities like Silver Bay and surrounding towns have innovated their own responses to gaps in care, coalescing around community groups like the North Shore Mental Health Group. Key findings include a need for support that wraps around the community above and

beyond the patient needing care. These include support groups for first responders and family members of individuals experiencing mental health concerns. The attendees communicated a strong focus around community-led programs that can reduce isolation after mental health crises.

According to Zomi Bloom, Telehealth Program Manager for Wilderness Health and program manager of the new project around mental and behavioral health care coordination, "We need to hear directly from community members what they would like to see when it comes to navigating the system of mental and behavioral healthcare. Most of our health outcomes are determined by factors outside of the proverbial four walls of the hospital or clinic."

The event was recorded by local Graphic Recorder Nelle Rhicard, who drew the feedback of the community into a wall-sized illustration of our priorities.
